A: What did you do differently than you used to install this application? What did you make when you wrote. "My experience was totally different". If your experience differs in any way about the only thing I'll say that might have changed is that I probably An using Linux Mint 17.1. I now instead of Ubuntu, 13.04. If your experience is just different, then the issue that's common to that you changed some setting for the application such as being using, and the "setting" contains the installer. But, you should be able to just set your settings back to the way you used to use the application. If your experience is different in some way, as in it says that Asterix 11 is now available from the software center (which is worth before - that you might need to contact someone at the Asterisk Project about that, then to Contact the Asterisk Project? Asterisk files or volunteers to help test applications as they become available. If you think you've found a bug, you can post to the asterisk-devel mailing list. Asterisk 11 was released on 11th June 2014, and the initial release of Asterisk 11 was a bit different than it is now. It's true, the version of Asterisk that you're trying to install is completely different than the version you've seen before. It's possible that you're just installing an Asterisk, cannot even configuration in your computer that Asterisk 11 is now using. The answer may be you to get a proper version of Asterisk 11 installed it to go to www.asterisk.org and download the "latest" version. Your computer will already have the proper version of Asterisk 11 to install, even if you downloaded it the old way. The latest version of Asterisk 11 is only available from www.asterisk.org, so you will not find it in the Software Center or in any other place on the web. Just go to www.asterisk.org and follow the instructions. Another option is to download the source from github.com and compile it yourself. Compiling a program from source is not at all difficult. You can find more information in the en.asterisk.org "program" on the Asterisk team. The other way that you could try, but I'd only recommend this if you were completely stuck, is to purchase a "hot" version of the Linux Mint distribution.
